The Village Health Partnership (VHP) is a 501(c) (3) nonprofit organization whose mission is to prevent maternal and neonatal death in childbirth, and to treat and prevent gynecologic complications of childbirth in rural Ethiopia.

Dear Friends.

Partnership is one of the key values of the Village Health Partnership (VHP), after all, it is right there in our name.

To begin with, all VHP programs are community based and community driven. Working with local stakeholders we have now begun to **successfully implement programs for safer motherhood** in some of the most remote and isolated parts of Ethiopia. Word of our approach and what has been achieved has spread.

You can imagine our excitement this spring when more rural communities stepped forward requesting that we partner with then to help women in need. U.S. based organizations have also begun to reach out to us, offering to share their expertise and to collaborate with VHP and local communities to implement programs. Now in 2016 and 2017 VHP is working in partnership with local communities and other U.S. based organizations to roll out programs that involve **capacity building** and **healthcare**, including the **education** and **training** of rural healthcare providers and **treatment** and **prevention** efforts.

Together, we are working to ensure that as women come into health centers and hospitals for delivery, these facilities have the infrastructure and skilled medical staff to provide them with the care that they need.

As VHP rolls out programs in rural Ethiopia, the need to procure more funding to support efforts for safer motherhood only increases. This reality led the Board of Directors to hire VHP's first ever employee, Rachel Buck. Rachel is an experienced non-profit professional with a passion for international work and women's rights. Her addition to the VHP team will help us reach our fundraising goals and continue life-saving and life-changing programs.

Thank you for your ongoing support and partnership. It is only with your help that we can continue to work for safer motherhood, ultimately helping women but also preserving families and strengthening communities.

FUTURE PLANS

CAPACITY BUILDING

- Partner with Waterlines, Inc. and Engineers Without Borders to insure that targeted healthcare facilities have access to clean water.
- Work to improve sanitation and hygiene at all health centers.
- Insure that rural health centers have solar lighting for labor and delivery rooms.
- Purchase and deliver needed medical equipment and supplies.
- Construct maternity waiting areas (MWAs) and rooms for labor and delivery and women's health services at key medical facilities.

HEALTHCARE

education and training

- Translate educational material into native languages to improve the learning experience.
- Continue to train rural health care providers, building their proficiency in neonatal resuscitation and infant care, emergency obstetric care and women's health.
- Establish and run three week intensive skill building sessions for midwives already practicing in the field.
- Provide scholarships to women in the community who wish to become nurse midwives.

treatment

 Continue to screen, transport, and treat women with gynecologic complications of childbirth.

PREVENTION

 Ultimately build capacity in health facilities, train healthcare providers and establish medical systems of care that will allow the prevention of maternal and neonatal death in childbirth and the development of gynecologic complications.













2014-2016 INCOME SOURCES TO-DATE
